purposes of diagnosis, treatment, appropriate management, or ongoing monitoring of an enrol	llee's
disease or condition to guide treatment decisions, when the test provides clinical utilit	y as
demonstrated by medical and scientific evidence, including, but not limited to:	
(1) Labeled indications for an FDA-approved or -cleared test or indicated tests for an F	DA-
approved drug;	
(2) Centers for Medicare Services ("CMS") National Coverage Determination	s or
Medicare Administrative Contractor ("MAC") Local Coverage Determinations; or	
(3) Nationally recognized clinical practice guidelines and consensus statements.	
(c) Coverage as defined in subsection (b) of this section shall be provided in a manner	that
limits disruptions in care including the need for multiple biopsies or biospecimen samples	

When and how will this act go into effect?

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

AN ACT

RELATING TO INSURANCE -- ACCIDENT AND SICKNESS INSURANCE POLICIES -- BIOMARKER TESTING COVERAGE

- This act would require health insurers, nonprofit hospital service corporations, nonprofit medical service corporations and health maintenance organizations to issue policies that provide coverage for biomarker testing, on or after January 1, 2024.
